2018 NAPLAN RESULTS: WOLLONDILLY ANGLICAN COLLEGE


Our College Community congratulates Year 7 and Year 9 students on their excellent NAPLAN results when compared to State average and also to similar schools.

Year 7

There were 121 students in Year 7 who sat NAPLAN online in 2018. It is very pleasing to note that -

- as a group, students in Year 7 achieved at similar to, or better than State averages for every area measured.
- 62% of Year 7 students achieved a Band 7 or higher.
- 27% of Year 7 students achieved in the top two bands.
- Wollondilly students have performed well in Year 7 numeracy exceeding both the State and SSCG group (similar schools) averages.
- Student growth data (an indicator of effective teaching and learning), is similar to or better than both State and other SSCG schools.


Spelling continues to be focus for the College moving forward as we look to increase growth in this area.



Year 9

There were 89 students who sat the NAPLAN tests in 2018. It is very pleasing to note that -

- As a group, when reported by ACARA, students achieved significantly better than, State averages for each area measured.
- There has been some positive growth data in this cohort from Year 7 to Year 9.
- Our students have continued to achieve or exceed expected growth in all areas.
- There is growth in numeracy (74%) and grammar and punctuation (75%) both of which have been a focus in the College.

PASTORAL MATTERS - MIDDLE YEARS 5-8

Firstly, welcome to the start of a brand new year and an extra special welcome to those of you who are new to the College. The start of a new year can often cause a degree of anxiety amongst not only students but also parents. It's perfectly normal for all families to feel this way especially as you are getting to know and understand the day to day life and culture here at Wollondilly Anglican College. While it's sometimes difficult to know exactly how our children will react to the start of a new College year, one thing we can be sure of is that all our children are different and will respond to new challenges, new teachers and a new environment differently. The important thing is that we encourage our children to work through these challenges, to listen to them, to help them seek



solutions and to ask for help when needed. It can sometimes be tricky as parents to know exactly when to step in and when to allow our children the space and time to work through challenges for themselves. If you feel your child is in need of some support as they begin the year, please email their class teacher if its learning related or their Year Patron if it's a pastoral concern. I would also encourage you to let the College know if your family is experiencing any difficult circumstances. This added information equips staff to better support our students.

Year 7 Camp - Week 3

Year 7 students will to be heading off to the Port Hacking River to stay at Youthworks Outdoor Recreation Camp. While away, students will be challenged and asked to step outside their comfort zones as they participate in activities such as Abseiling, Canoeing and Sailing. The camp also provides a great opportunity for students to get to know each other and staff outside the context of the College. We know that this will be a great time of learning, growth and new friendships being formed. Please return all notes by Tuesday, 5 February.

Pastoral Lessons commence Monday Week 2 Self Awareness

As part of supporting your child's overall wellbeing students participate in structured Pastoral Care lessons each Monday week B. In week 2 students are looking into the topic of Self- Awareness. Developing your self-awareness helps you learn more about yourself and what you're capable of. By becoming self-aware and understanding your strengths and limitations, you open up opportunities that aren't always available otherwise. You're also able to have more honest and genuine relationships because the people that you invest time in will be attracted to you for who you actually are.

In order to give you an insight into what your child will be explore I've included three ways to become self-aware 1. Assess your self-talk

The first step in self-awareness is to listen to yourself. What's going on in your mind? Is it a series of negative thoughts that make you feel down? Or are you always looking on the bright side? *In practice:* Take a couple of minutes each day to be conscious of your inner voice. One way of getting your inner voice going is to stand in front of a mirror and hear what you're saying to yourself about how you look. It might even help to write down your thoughts so that you can get a better idea of how positive or negative they are.

2. Use your senses

Your senses (sight and sound, in particular) can provide you with huge insights into your own and other people's feelings, and situations in general. But these senses are often viewed through the filter of our self-talk. For example, a frown doesn't always mean that someone's angry, and a groan doesn't necessarily mean that the person you're talking with is bored, despite what your inner voice might be saying. *In practice:* The next time you feel that someone is judging you, or has made you feel bad about yourself, take a step back and write down why you think this. Ask yourself, 'Could I have interpreted what was said/done differently?' You might find that your interpretation was clouded by your own negative thoughts.

3. Tune into your feelings

This can be hard if you're not the kind of person who likes to think too deeply about your feelings. Your feelings are spontaneous and emotional responses to the things you experience. Like your senses, they give you good information about what's going on around you, should you choose to tune into them. There are some physical signs that you can look for that might help you to 'read' your feelings. They include:

- A warm feeling in your face might mean you're embarrassed.
- A feeling of 'butterflies' in your tummy can mean you're nervous.
- Clenching your teeth might mean you're angry.

In practice: Be aware of physical signs that might indicate how you're feeling. By engaging with how you're feeling, you can get better insights into what you like, what makes you feel uncomfortable and what makes you angry.

TERM 1 TRAFFIC ALERT

As we are a growing College, traffic will increase every year. While we are working currently with Wollondilly Shire Council for approval to build a new second entrance, this is taking longer than expected.

Please remember that during the first few days of Term 1 2019, traffic on Remembrance Drive will be extremely busy with queues expected to be banked back all the way to the Bargo River due to new families driving students to the College. To assist us to make it easier for everyone please follow the instructions below.

- 1. The peak traffic time is between 7.45 am and 8.15 am. Avoid this time if you can.
- 2. To save last minute rushing and traffic, COME EARLIER! Easier to find parking and more relaxed.
- 3. Don't park out on Remembrance Drive. It is a NO STOPPING zone.
- 4. College roadway speed limit is 10kph which basically is crawling speed.
- **5. Be aware of your children** in the carpark areas. Please don't let them run around the bus bay and car parking spaces.
- **6. Crossing carparks** between vehicles is very risky as drivers travelling through them don't see you till you emerge from behind the vehicle, especially high vehicles.
- 7. Children being left in cars alone while the parent walks into the College to pick up siblings is a dangerous practice and will be reported to Police.
- 8. Do not chat in carpark areas as kids get bored and run around cars while waiting for you.
- 9. There are two set down and pickup areas at the front of the College, one in front of White Cottage and the other around the flag poles. We have now had made two "A frame" signs outlining what to do and not do. The west end of the bus bay can be used for quick drop offs but please do not get in the way of the buses.

Please understand, our main purpose is to ensure safety on College grounds for everyone. The carparks and roadways are high risk areas which require strict rules. We have been blessed these past 15 years with no major incident inside or outside of the College. Let's all work together with patience in keeping it this way.

Mr David Low; Property and Maintenance Staff 2019


David is an active member of Harrington Park Anglican College. He is part of the music and setup teams.

Music and Dance Scholarships

- Parents should complete the scholarship application form and return it to the Development
- Officer, Mrs Kristy Biddle with the supporting portfolio.
- Music/Dance scholarships need to be accompanied by a scholarship application processing fee of \$100.00.
- Short listed students will be required to audition before a panel. There will not be an additional audition fee.

Applications opened on Tuesday, 4 September 2018 and will close on Friday, 1 February 2019. The closing date is final and late applications cannot be accepted.
