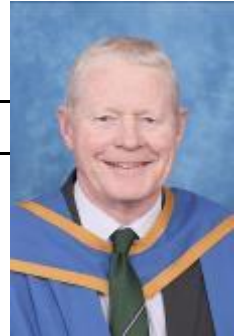

Fun and Learning At Camp

Last Thursday I was fortunate enough to visit the Year 7 Camp. The opportunity to be out of my office and have contact with our students always allows me to put a lot of things in perspective. It reminds me of our main purpose, which is about providing quality Christian education and the opportunities our students have to develop their character.

On camp, students undertake Christian Discovery discussions with the Youthworks Team Leaders. This provides them with opportunities to explore what Christianity is about in a fun and relaxed environment. It reinforces some of the lessons learned at the College and asks them to consider the choices available to them in their lives in developing a relationship with God. It also builds on the Second Education we offer - developing values, morals and character.

In a world that seems to contribute worries for us all, bad news stories in the media and the ongoing issues around COVID-19, it was refreshing to see our students outdoors and having fun. They were unencumbered by devices, didn't need to engage with social media, and free from the routines of their regular life.

As they slid down the water slide and swam in the pool, they were laughing, joking and enjoying themselves as kids should be able to do. It was evident that new friendships had developed or existing friendships had been strengthened.

I joined a group of students at the 'Sky Web' which is a high ropes course, approximately five metres off the ground. All the activities at the Anglican Youthworks Centres are 'challenge by choice'. Students aren't forced to participate in the activities but they are encouraged to engage, participate and evaluate once the activity is completed.

The Sky Web is a challenging obstacle course. Although students wear helmets and safety harnesses, which stop them falling once they are off the ground, it is a challenging exercise for them to make their way along the wobbly platforms on the course. It seems much higher looking down once on the course than it does from the solid ground looking up. On the ground, the other students use ropes to support those on the course and move the obstacles and platforms so the student can access each stage. This requires a great deal of teamwork. It was heartening to see the encouragement and support for one another during the activity.

Most students attempted the course and learned a lot about themselves during the experience. Some put on the safety gear but were unable to proceed, however, they were still part of the team assisting the others to complete the course. They all seemed to learn from the experience. For those who completed the challenge they learned a lot about their capacity to push through challenges they face even when they are worried or anxious. They all learned the importance of being supportive of one another and working as a team.

At the end of the course, there is a free drop from an elevated platform where students step out and drop to the ground (on a cable of course). A fitting and exhilarating way to finish the course.

Well done to our Year 7 students. Thanks to our generous staff who supervised at the camp.

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is operating at Wollondilly Anglican College with students in Year 9 (aged 14 or older) able to join the program.

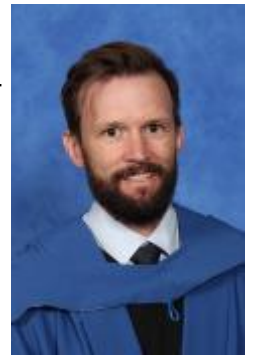

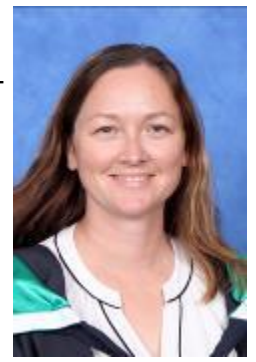
Middle Chapel, Term 1

- Medical information for each student must be up to date using the Parent Portal on Edumate.
- All medications need to be brought to the office at least two business days prior to camp (Wednesday, 25 February) with a medication form filled in. These must be clearly labelled with instructions.
- Students are not to carry their own personal medication except for Ventolin and Epipens (daily medications will be administered by teachers at Camp, as per the given instructions).
- Paracetamol and Antihistamine will be taken and administered by a teacher if needed.

Separate to this, the students have been given a 'what to bring' list and reminded that they will be required to hand in any mobile devices upon their arrival at Camp.

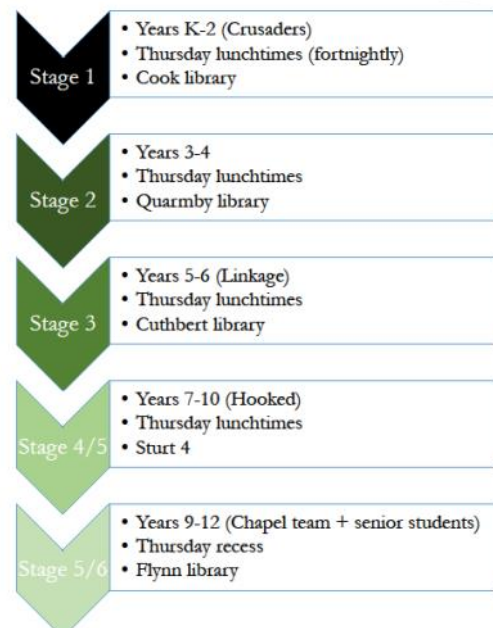

No Right Turn & Set Down Bays

As you will be aware, the morning peak traffic time is between 7.45 am and 8.15 am. Avoid this time if you can. The orange cones are placed at the front carpark intersection to stop vehicles turning right during the peak time to keep traffic flowing inside and out of the College. To gain access to Admin or the front carpark, please continue past the front carpark intersection to the roundabout, return to the intersection and turn left toward the set down bays.

To save last minute rushing and traffic, COME EARLIER! It's easier to find parking and is more relaxed.

There are two set-down and pick-up areas at the front of the College, one in front of White Cottage and the other around the flag poles. We have two 'A frame' signs outlining what to do and not do. The west end of the bus bay can be used for quick drop offs but **please do not get in the way of the buses.**

On Wednesday, 10 February we had the Year 7 students arriving with luggage to take on camp so traffic was very busy.

Please understand, our main purpose is to ensure safety on College grounds for everyone. The carparks and roadways are high risk areas which require strict rules. Please be patient and work with our staff who are directing traffic.
