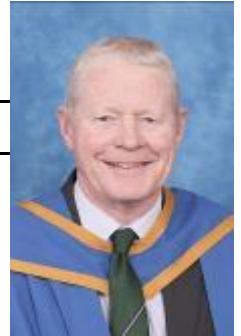

#### **Cares and Worries**

Are you a worrier? Do you have trouble letting things go?

Often we have genuine worries and we are not sure how we can carry the burden. These burdens may relate to concerns about our children, health and financial issues, disappointment, loneliness or rejection. Sometimes we don't know who to turn to.

Jesus said: *Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light* (Matthew 11:28-30 NIV).

The reality is that life can be very difficult, but these are the very kinds of burdens that Jesus wants us to bring to him. Jesus is saying, "Come to me all you who are struggling with life in any way, and those of you who have burdens that you can't carry alone, and I will help you with your struggles."

Sometimes of course, in our minds, our worries make issues bigger than they are. We often sweat about the 'first world' problems that on a global scale aren't that significant. While Jesus can help us with our burdens, sometimes our perception of things and the way we think can re-shape our view of the world and its problems.

I thought I would include a copy of an email that has done the circuit over the last few years. It tends to capture both the sentiments outlined above.

#### **Memo from God (The Boss)**

To You  
Subject Yourself - Life

I am God. I will be handling all your problems. Please remember that I do not need your help. If life happens to deliver a situation that you cannot handle, do not attempt to resolve it. Kindly put it in the SFGTD (Something for God to do) basket. All situations will be resolved, but in my time, not yours.

Once the matter is placed into the basket, do not hold onto it by worrying about it. Instead, focus on all the wonderful things that are present in your life now.

If you find yourself stuck in traffic, don't despair. There are people in the world for whom driving is an unheard privilege.

Should you have a bad day at work, think of the man who has been out of work for years. Should you despair over a relationship gone bad, think of the person who has never known what it is like to love or be loved in return.

Should you grieve about the passing of another weekend, think of the woman in dire straits, working 12 hours a day, seven days a week to feed her children.

Should your car breakdown, leaving you stranded, think of the paraplegic who would love the opportunity to take that walk.

Should you notice a grey hair in the mirror, think of the cancer patient in chemo who wishes she had hair to examine.

Should you find yourself at a loss and pondering what is life all about, asking what is my purpose? Be thankful. There are those who didn't live long enough to get the opportunity. Should you find yourself the victim of other people's bitterness, ignorance, smallness and insecurities, remember, things could be worse. You could be one of them.



# INTERIM HEADMASTER

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## Update on College Second Entrance

Thank you to parents and carers for your ongoing patience with this process. We understand the frustration that exists regarding the traffic management on Remembrance Drive.

For the Second Entrance to commence we have been following a lengthy process to submit a rezoning application for the Olive Farms with Wollondilly Council. This was done in 2019.

The process has moved from the College dealing directly with the Council to the Council dealing with NSW Planning. NSW Planning are considering the report and have asked us for further information which we have supplied. The application still sits with the NSW Planning Department.

Mr Fred Schroder (Property Manager), Mr Kim De Roy (TASC Project Manager) and I met with our local NSW MP Nathaniel Smith (MP) last week to discuss the delays. He was sympathetic to our issues regarding the traffic management at the entrance to the College.

Hopefully we will have some further progress on the matter soon.

## Duke of Edinburgh's Award - Training and Preparation Day

On Saturday, 20 March a Training and Preparation Day will be held to prepare students for their first expedition which will occur on Saturday, 27 and Sunday, 28 March.

Due to the risks inherent with the Duke of Edinburgh Award Hiking Program at least one **parent or carer is required to attend the first 20 minutes with their son or daughter** on the training day.

Details are as follows for the Training Day:

- Commences at 8.30 am at the College in the Warne Auditorium and concludes 2.00 pm.
- Parents will need to sign-in at the Auditorium using the College QR Code and maintain physical distancing from one another.
- Students will need to bring - hat, sunscreen, water bottle, clothes for walking in bush, suitable shoes for bush walking, a pen and food for recess and lunch if they don't plan to have a sausage sandwich from the Working Bee BBQ. The students will be supervised and instructed by Mr Croger, Mrs Cochrane and Mrs Hyslop.

Activities will include instruction on safety, first aid, navigating using a map and compass, equipment to take, route planning for the expedition, requirements and expectations for an expedition, cooking and camping skills.

Students will need to be registered with the Duke of Edinburgh's Award program to attend the day.

## WORK EXPERIENCE AND OBTAINING LEAVE FROM THE COLLEGE

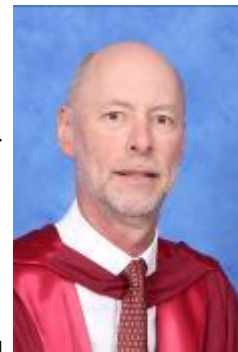
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Many students undertake Work Experience while they are attending Wollondilly Anglican College. Work Experience is a great way to make an informed choice about a potential career before students make any commitments, ie choose Year 11 subjects or sign-up for an apprenticeship.

Typically, Year 10 students participate in the College Work Experience Program during the final week of the Term 2 holidays (while staff are attending Professional Development). However, staff at the College understand that this week may not be convenient with all employers, or families. If it is necessary for students to undertake work experience outside of this time, it is essential that special leave be obtained from the Deputy Headmaster and the necessary paperwork be completed prior to the student commencing work experience. Clearly, there are legal guidelines involving insurance etc which must be adhered to when students are involved in such activities.

I encourage students and their parents to discuss their plans with me so that I can issue them with the appropriate paperwork ahead of time. One final piece of advice, please select a week in which students do not have any formal assessments.

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The 2021 Bebras Australia Computational Thinking Challenge is part of an international initiative that promotes Computational Thinking amongst students. Bebras is aligned with and supports both the NESA Science and Digital Technology Curriculum and the Australian Digital Technologies Curriculum.

The challenge will be for students in Years 5 and 6 and delivered online during one hour of your child's Digital Technology class time. Each student has been given a consent form that will need to be returned before Thursday, 25 March. These forms can be returned to your child's class teacher or the front office.

Each year students from the challenge, who attain a 100% score are eligible to be included in the Bebras Australia Computational Thinking Challenge Honour Roll. They will have their name published on the Bebras Australia Honour Roll website [digitalcareers.csiro.au/Honour-Roll](http://digitalcareers.csiro.au/Honour-Roll) and have a certificate of achievement presented to them.

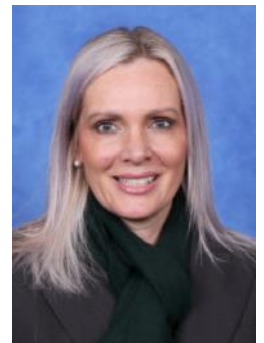
