Retirement

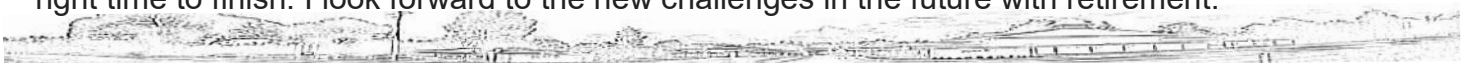
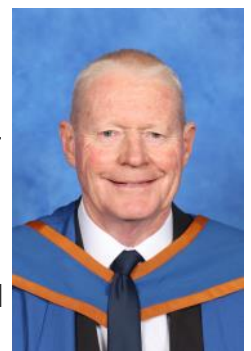
Last week I informed the staff of my intention to retire at the end of this year.

College Hours - Important Supervision Reminders

Mornings

It is wonderful that students are keen to get to the College each morning. This does however create supervision problems when students arrive prior to 7.30 am. Parents are reminded that students are not to be on College Grounds until after 7.30 am when teacher supervision commences. Senior students who drive should not be arriving prior to 7.30 am. Once they have parked they need to move directly to the Flynn area.

Afternoons

The College day concludes at 2.35 pm. Students need to move directly to their transport home (pickup or bus) or attend any pre arranged co curricular activity (For example, Homework Club, After School Care or band). Students who have missed buses or are waiting for transport should do this at Student Reception where supervision of students will occur.

Lunchtime Library

The Libraries in Sturt and Johnson are open during the second half of lunch. Students should not be in Libraries outside of this time unless under the direction supervision of a teacher.

Changes to Sign in and Sign out Procedures

Parents and students were notified of minor changes to procedures at the end of last term. When signing in late or signing out early, students need to present to Student Reception with their Diaries so they can be stamped with the time of arrival or departure.

Student ID Cards

When signing in late, students should be accessing the Self Serve Kiosk in Student Reception. To use this facility students need to have their Student ID Card to scan in. Once you have followed the prompt, please get your Diary stamped at Student Reception.

YEAR 10 VACCINATIONS

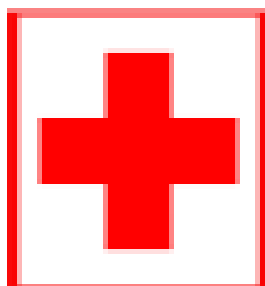


Year 10 Vaccinations will be held on Wednesday, 12 May. Vaccination cards need to be returned to Student Reception as soon as possible.

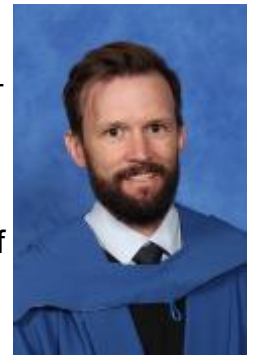


FAREWELL MRS CAROLYN RICHARDS

PASTORAL MATTERS - MIDDLE YEARS 5-8



Middle Chapel

This term in Middle Chapel, students will be learning about the story of Joseph from Genesis in the Old Testament. This story shows us how God wants us to respond during trials, adversity and betrayal. We will discover how God is constant through all of these challenging situations and how the plan of God is not simply to give us a surface peace but, rather, to establish in each of us a deep peace that endures through hardship. We will also explore how Joseph forgives his brothers, who have wronged him.

We are best able to forgive when we can see the overarching plan of God at work around us and when we recognise that, like Joseph's brothers, we are guilty and have been forgiven much. The willingness to forgive must be an active part of living Godly lives.

Stage 3 PC Lessons - Service Learning

Students in Years 5 & 6 will be planning and implementing service learning projects this Term. Students will be serving either the College community or the African Aids Foundation. They will develop their projects and in the final week of term we will be running a Service Week, so keep an eye for student led fundraising and volunteering.

During this time they will also be learning more about their character strengths. Making students aware that every one of them has all 24 character strengths, provides the foundation for genuine self-confidence grounded in self-awareness. At the same time, it helps children better understand why everyone is different and how to appreciate those differences.

Stage 4 - PC Projects - Changing online cultures

This Term, Years 7 & 8 will be taking part in lessons based on aspects of the 'Yes Project' from the E-Safety Commission. These lessons are based on a digital and social health program encouraging young people to act as positive leaders and supportive friends in social spaces, especially online. Students will learn about their digital communities, and ways that they can transform them into caring, supportive and healthy environments.

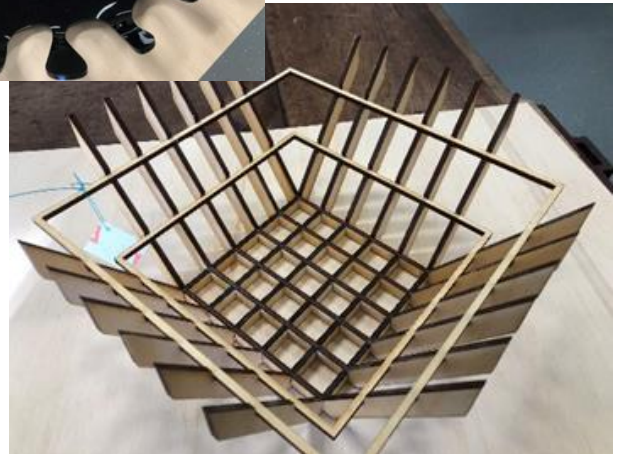
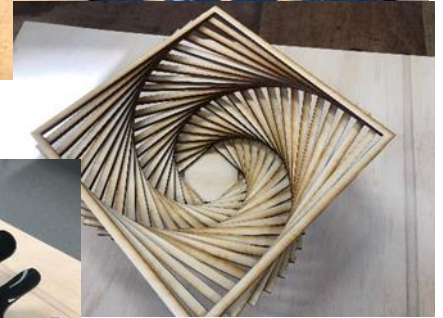
TAS NEWS

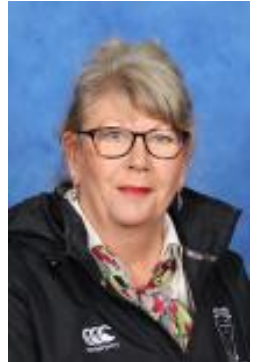
As the Term progresses you will find some winter warming meals on the menu to be enjoyed by all.
