COLLEGE PHOTO DAY



The College Photo Day will take place on Thursday, 27 May 2021 for Transition 2 Day to Year 12 students. Transition 3 Day students will have their photos taken on Wednesday, 26 May 2021.

If you have a child in a Transition 3 Day class and would like to order a photo with their sibling at the College, this can be organised for Wednesday, 26 May between 7.50 am and 8.10 am in the College Cafeteria. Please have your children ready in their full College Winter Uniform at the Cafeteria prior to the photo. Siblings in Years 3-6 will need to change into their College Sports Uniform after the photo has been taken. Please email me at a.hitchins@wac.nsw.edu.au to book in for the photo.

Sibling photos for all other students from Transition 2 Day to Year 12 will take place on Thursday, 27 May 2021 during Recess and Lunch in Deakin 2 & 3 (see below).

You do not need to email me to book in for this photo.

Please have your older sibling collect the younger sibling/s and take them to Deakin 2 & 3 for the photo.

Sibling photos on Thursday, 27 May are split into two groups based on the first letter of the oldest sibling's surname.

Recess	Surname A-L
Lunch	Surname M-Z

Students must bring their completed Sibling Photo Envelopes with them on the day.

Additional envelopes can be collected from Student Reception.

The Sibling Photo sessions are strictly for Sibling Photos, not friend groups.

The School Photographer - Frequently Asked Questions

Q. When do I return the photo order form?

All students need to bring their photo envelope to the College on Thursday, 27 May, the day of the photographs.

Q. I've lost my envelope. What should I do?

You can still order online without an envelope. Just use the College's Online Order Code **X1230PSB44W** and enter this into the website www.theschoolphotographer.com.au to place an order. You will also be prompted to enter your child's details. Just print the receipt and bring it on Photo Day instead of an envelope.

Q. My child forgot to hand in their envelope. What should I do?

ALL students are photographed on the day so you will not miss out. If you have already paid online, it is not a problem. We have a record of your order and you will receive your photos when they are delivered to the College. Keep the envelope at home with the receipt number written on it as a record of your order.

If your envelope contained cash, then it is too late now to pay by cash. You can still order and pay online using the code on the envelope. If it is within three weeks of photo day, your photos will be delivered to the College with the College's main delivery. After this time, it will become a 'late order' and will be delivered to the College within a month from the ordering date.

Q. HELP! It's photo day and I haven't ordered yet!

Parents can use our online ordering system to purchase photos up to a week after Photo Day. ALL students are photographed on the day so you will not miss out.

Sibling photos cannot be ordered after Photo Day

Sibling photos can be ordered online up to 8.00 am on the day of photography.

Between 8.00 am and 10.00 am on Photo Day a sibling photo can still be ordered but only using a cash envelope (available from the College office). The students must be sure to present themselves when sibling photos are being taken - (Surnames A-L at recess and Surnames M-Z at lunch).

Q. Can I still order and pay for photos after photo day?

Parents can use our online ordering system to purchase photos up to a week after Photo Day.

There is no need to return the envelope if you order online after Photo Day.

ALL students are photographed on the day so you will not miss out. Sibling photos cannot be ordered after Photo Day.

Year 9 Textiles Technology

This Term in Textiles Technology Year 9 students are looking at Textiles and Culture. As part of this unit they investigate how various cultures around the world use textiles as a method of decoration, and also how textiles play a role in clothing and apparel.

Students explore how textiles are also used in other areas, such as homewares and furnishings. The students will complete two projects during their study:

- A 'Boro' stitched item based on the Japanese practice of reusing textile scraps. This style of stitching originated in medieval Japan and has evolved four centuries later into a distinctive textile art form. It is produced by using a simple running stitch also known as a sashiko stitch to secure the scraps together, which are overlapped to create one piece of cloth.
- The second item the students will create is an African inspired basket. In this project, students will use raffia to weave and stitch to create a simple basket that can be used throughout the home.

YEAR 12 COMMUNITY AND FAMILY STUDIES (CAFS) VIRTUAL BABY



Year 12 CAFS students are currently studying "Parenting and Caring". As part of this unit they are learning about the roles and responsibilities of Parents/Carers and how to prepare to be a Parent/Carer. To help reinforce their learning and simulate concepts addressed in class, students have the opportunity to be a parent for a weekend by caring for a virtual baby. They are required to attend to the baby's needs by settling, changing nappies, feeding, burping, changing clothes and ensuring its temperature is regulated. The virtual baby/simulator measures the level of care provided in these areas as well as the number of mishandles eg head support.

At the end of the process students are given a simulation report that gives them a score. More importantly they have the opportunity to reflect on rewarding parts of the experience; challenging parts of the experience and what roles and skills are required by a Parent/Carer to enhance the wellbeing of the dependant and themselves.

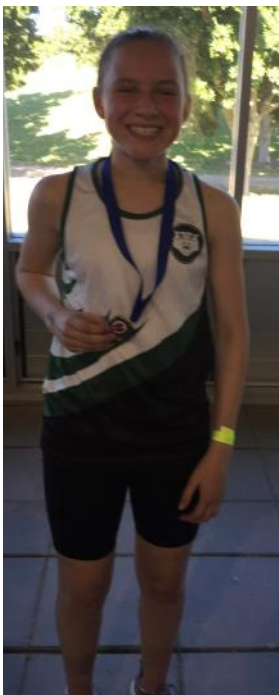

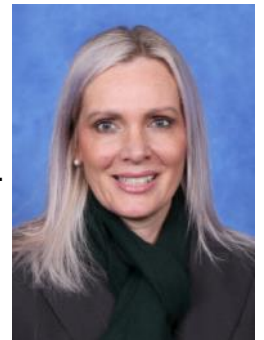
APPLICATION FOR ENROLMENT

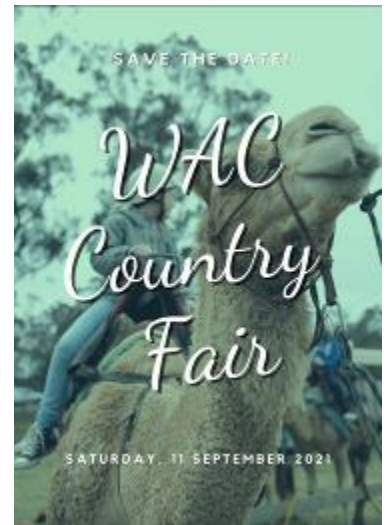
