

PASTORAL MATTERS - MIDDLE YEARS 5-8

Social Emotional Literacy - Empathy

Empathy is the ability to understand the emotions of others. Empathy helps us understand how others are feeling, what their motivations are, and what their perspective might be. Without empathy and respect for others, it's easy to act in ways that hurt other people.



There are many ways students can get what they need without having a negative impact on others, and it's important to help them learn the skills to do this.

Developing empathy is important as it teaches us to reflect, observe and think about our own behaviour. It helps young people to notice and name feelings and communicate them to others appropriately.

Here are some things that you can do to help your child develop the ability to understand the emotions of others:

- Talk often about feelings in life. Talk about feelings in real-life situations, or examples on television.
- Ask them what they notice. What do they believe people are feeling, based on their non-verbal communication - facial expressions, body language, and tone of voice? Labelling these feelings will help them think about and understand others.
- Help them understand the other person's point of view. Ask them what they think the other
 person might be thinking, or how they might see the situation. Ask them what the other person
 might want to happen and why.
- Model empathy. The best way to teach empathy is to live empathy.

Service Learning Projects

The service learning projects continued this week and are moving along well. Groups have designed, planned and are now starting to create some wonderful selfless projects.

Projects in the Middle Years include fundraising concepts for African Aids Foundation and the Silver Coin Project, as well as creative projects like bug hotels and bee baths.

Adjustments they have made include creating digital content to support their Junior peers and developing contactless ways to connect with and maintain our community partnerships.



SECONDARY TOURNAMENT OF MINDS 2020

On Wednesday, 9 September, four Tournament of Minds teams from Years 7-10 submitted their short films to the Sydney South-West region. The Challenges stretched all teams (one STEM and three Social Science teams) this year and all teams did the College proud. The first Social Science team of Eliza Eaton (10), Paris Obakpolo (10), Ridhima Saroya (10), Chelsea Luppino (10), Jasmyn Spinks (10) and Hagen Bossie (10) explored issues surrounding marketing of beauty products and the influence they have on teenage body image.

Applications will open on Tuesday, 29 September 2020 and will close on Friday, 5 February 2021. The closing date is final and late applications cannot be accepted.




