The End of an Era

I write to inform the Wollondilly Anglican College community of the pending retirement of our Founding Headmaster, Dr Quarmby who will retire at the end of Term 2 next year. Dr Quarmby has made this decision to focus on medical issues he faces and to spend more time with his family and grandchildren.

The College Council is very thankful to God for the Godly leadership Dr Quarmby has given as Founding Headmaster.

Dr Quarmby's infectious enthusiasm for all things "Wollondilly" (and the Tigers) is legendary. Since the establishment of the College in 2004, Dr Quarmby has played a vital role in creating a Christian culture that values the pursuit of excellence in all areas. He has vigorously promoted the concept of a "second education" where students have been encouraged to adopt Christian morals, standards and ethics. He has actively encouraged a pride in belonging to a vibrant College community but at the same time has emphasised the importance of interacting with the wider community.

As Headmaster, his concern for the needs of individual students and the welfare of all members of staff is evidence of the depth of his compassion for others. He frequently reminds everyone that the God he serves loves each one of them deeply. Under his leadership our integrated libraries have created a unique 21st century learning environment that has contributed significantly to the high academic results being achieved. Dr Quarmby's attention to detail has been evident in the multitude of building programs undertaken during his Headship. It is expected that, by the time he retires, work will have commenced on the last of our major teaching blocks.

Dr Quarmby has demonstrated an impressive quality in leadership. He has balanced his attention to detail with a broad vision for the future. For example, he has, while managing the daily challenges in the College, provided for future expansion by arranging for the purchase of adjoining land known as the Olive Groves. In addition, his strong advocacy for the future development of a campus of the College at Wilton has been motivated by his desire for parents in this newly developing area to be able to choose an education similar to that offered at Wollondilly. Outside the College he has been actively involved in the leadership of several professional associations and is a valued member of the Anglican Schools Corporation. He will be sorely missed by students, staff and parents.

The Anglican Schools Corporation and our College Council will begin the process of finding a new Head to lead the College into the next exciting stage of development. Should this process not be completed by the middle of next year, parents can be assured that the College will be in the capable hands of Mr Croger and our very experienced senior staff. Their proven experience over many years will be invaluable in this process of change. During the first half of next year, various opportunities will be provided for all those who wish to express their appreciation to Dr Quarmby for the impact that he has had on their lives. Please join with the College Council in praying that we all might manage the process of change well and particularly pray for Dr and Mrs Quarmby as they prepare for a well earned retirement.

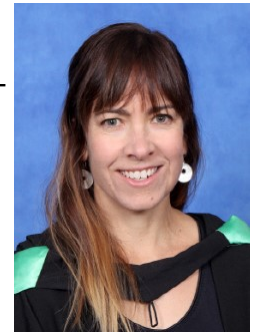

PASTORAL MATTERS - SENIOR YEARS 9-12



Peer Support...Connect > Build > Belong

'Pride in Belonging' is a core distinctive of the College, a value which we aim to promote and instil across our student body. One particular area which we believe allows students to develop this is through peer support activities.

Within College life there are many opportunities for students to be involved as a Peer Support Leader or being supported through various programs and activities.

Bus Monitors - over the next week we will be seeking expressions of interest from Year 10 students regarding becoming a WAC Bus Monitor for the remainder of Term 4, and 2020. Within this role, Bus Monitors will be attentive to what is occurring during travel time, communicate any issues to relevant staff and will provide support when necessary. Students selected will visit junior classes to introduce themselves and talk about their role.

Years 10-12 Volleyball Competition - this competition takes place each Friday at lunchtime in the Senior Precinct. House Captains have selected their teams and are assisting in coordinating this activity. The aim is for students to interact, build rapport, to develop a sense of teamwork and enjoy participating in a lunchtime activity.

Peer Support Leaders - Year 9 students have had the opportunity to express their interest in being a Peer Support Leader in 2020 for a Year 7 student. This program runs throughout Term 1. Once leaders have been selected, they will participate in a two day College workshop, where they will learn about personal characteristics, leadership qualities, communication skills and strategies for dealing with group activities. In previous years this has been a very successful program and we look forward to continuing this for 2020.

Digital Ambassadors Team - next week during roll call the team of Years 8 and 9 students will be delivering a presentation regarding cyber safety and responsible use of ICT to Year 6. As they prepare for Year 7 it will be helpful for the Year 6 cohort to hear important information from students who they can relate to. It is also an opportunity for them to identify a group of students who will be able to provide support as they move into their Secondary Years.

Year 9-10 Pastoral Care

The theme of Pastoral Care sessions this Term is 'Broadening your Focus', gaining an awareness of the needs of others, looking for opportunities to serve and thinking beyond yourself. Within the boys' groups, students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of practical activities, which support both the College and wider community.

Some of the activities include - making tie dye bags and wooden chopping boards as a fundraiser for Hope Street Mission, visiting and spending some time with residents in the Queen Victoria Nursing Home, supporting Transition and Kindergarten students with learning and gross motor activities and working on a small garden project.

As students work within a group to complete a task, show support in a variety of contexts, share their ideas and learn some new skills we hope that they will gain a sense of connectedness, self confidence and purpose.

YEAR 9 GRACE AND FAITH GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

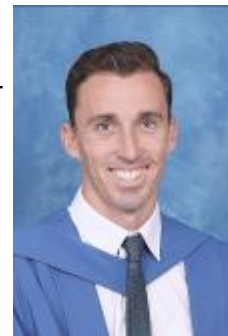

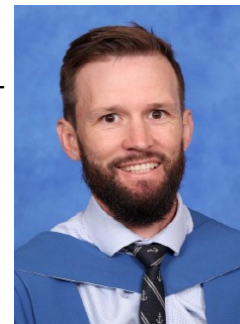

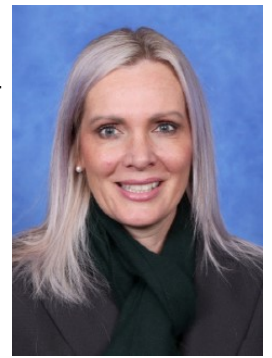

BUS BAY REMINDER

It has been brought to our attention by the bus company that vehicles are lingering in the bus bay which is not allowing buses to drop off students safely.

1. **There are two set down and pickup areas** at the front of the College, one in front of White Cottage and the other around the flag poles. In these locations, we have two 'A frame signs' outlining what to do and not to do.
2. As per my previous notifications, due to lots of students being dropped off, we are allowing the use of the very west end of the bus bay to be used for quick drop offs but do not drop students off near the eastern end of the bus bay.
3. The driver of any vehicle dropping off in the bus bay must stay in the driver's seat so that they can drive away after dropping students off, **please do not get in the way of the buses.**

Whooping Cough



We have had a confirmed case of Whooping Cough in our College.

Children receive their immunisation for Whooping Cough from six weeks of age with course completion at four years of age. The booster is then given in Year 7. Although the vaccination is not 100% effective, immunised children are less likely to catch it.
