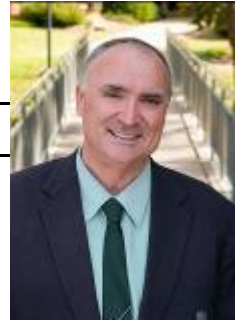

#### Fire and Drought

The following is an extract from a news item from the Jericho Road Organisation. Their updates are different from those received in news headlines. They are an organisation with a remit to help those trying to respond to earthly tragedies and to find words for prayer to God. This may help you as it helped me -

*Psalm 145: 8-9 The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made.*

While today is cooler and calmer, many fires remain at a serious level. There is little doubt we are at the beginning of a serious fire season unless there is plentiful rain across the country. Please continue to pray that God would have mercy and send rain, to ease the fires and to break the drought.

For today, please pray:

- Giving thanks to God for His great mercy
- For drought and fire breaking rain
- For those who have lost loved ones - that they would not be alone as they grieve and that they may know God's love
- For those who have been injured - that they would be healed and that those caring for them would have the skill and wisdom to support them as they recover
- For those who have lost their homes - 100 confirmed and likely to be around 300 - that they would be supported, comforted and cared for in the immediate and the long term
- For those near the fires that are still at a serious level - that they would remain safe, that they would be able to get some rest and that they would be able to turn to God with their anxieties
- For those who are struggling with the changes to their usual days and the stress of the past days and weeks because of closed schools, closed roads, loved ones in danger and the impact of smoke on their health - that they would be sustained
- For those bearing the burden of command, particularly yesterday but also in the following weeks and months - thank God for them, pray that they would be able to rest and find the personal support they need, pray for continued wisdom
- For those in emergency services, both on the ground and in support capacities - thank God for them, pray that they would be able to rest and recover, pray that they would be supported and that those who have been away from family will be able to see their loved ones soon, pray for their continued safety
- For God's people - that they would be able to show His love in difficult circumstances, love their neighbours and speak the name of Jesus to those who grieve and fear and suffer

Jericho Road will continue to send our prayer letters over the coming weeks and months - for both those affected by fires and the drought. We know that people in those areas appreciate your prayers. ## Whooping Cough



We have had a confirmed case of Whooping Cough in our College.

Children receive their immunisation for Whooping Cough from six weeks of age with course completion at four years of age. The booster is then given in Year 7. Although the vaccination is not 100% effective, immunised children are less likely to catch it.

# FROM THE DEPUTY'S DESK

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## Requesting a Record of School Achievement (RoSA) Credential for Eligible School Leavers



To be issued with a RoSA a school leaver must have...

- Completed Year 10 or Year 11;
- Completed courses of study that satisfy NESA's curriculum and assessment requirements;
- Complied with all requirements imposed by the Minister or NESA; and
- Left the NSW education system

Students cannot request a RoSA directly from NESA. The College must generate this request.

A student who has withdrawn from or not completed Year 10 is not eligible for a RoSA. Students who leave school without completing Year 10 may receive a Transcript of Study.

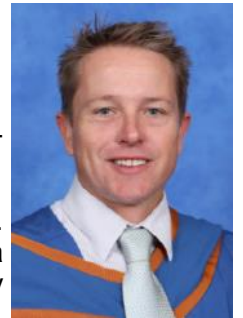
**A student who is transferring to another school is not a school-leaver.** A RoSA is not issued to any student who remains at school. All students can access a report of their accumulating academic achievements by generating an e-Record via their secure personalised *Students Online* account.

RoSA credentials are provided to students electronically as a PDF. Students can download, save and print their RoSA directly from their *Students Online* account. They will need to log in using their student number and PIN. *Students Online* accounts remain open until 30 June of the year after the student leaves school. Students can order a printed copy of their RoSA credential for a nominal fee.

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### Backing Up Your Files

It is always good practice to maintain duplicate copies of your assignments and classwork. These copies could be kept either in the cloud or on an external thumb drive. I take the extra step of keeping an external drive with my important files and photos at a place other than my primary residence.

Year 12 are currently in the middle of a heavy assessment period and I encourage all students to be backing up their working files to prevent unnecessary stress from computer malfunctions or loss of a device.

### Yearly Reports

In the coming weeks parents will be receiving their child's Yearly 2 Report. This report provides information on both second semester achievement as well as achievement across the entire course (some courses are for a semester and some are for the year). The definitions below give guidance as you read the report. Parents are reminded that if they would like to discuss their child's social development or academic progress they can arrange a meeting with either the relevant Year Patron or Class Teacher.

<i>Course Grade:</i>	Is the final grade achieved by the student across the course.
<i>Application:</i>	A measure of each student's achievement and effort in individual class work, assignments and homework for the semester.
<i>Indicators of Learning:</i>	Are used to indicate the level of each student's performance against course outcomes for the semester.
<i>Course Grade Distribution</i>	Percentage of students achieving each grade in the Yearly Report.

Thanks goes to Mr Powter, Mr Hewitt and the grounds and office staff who assisted in the organisation of this worthwhile event.

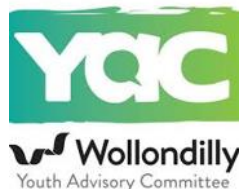
## Youth Mental Health Summit

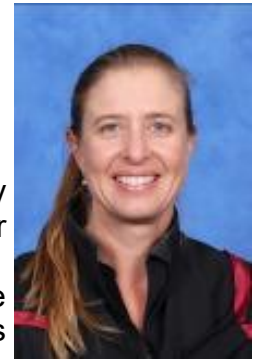

After morning tea, the students walked through Miller's Point to Barangaroo Reserve and completed more fieldwork activities. Following a quick lunch stop, we continued through Miller's Point and Walsh Bay to observe the gentrification which has taken place in the neighbouring suburbs.

The students showed great interest and enthusiasm in the studies they undertook. They were appreciative of the opportunity to study Geography as it is meant to be, getting first hand experience in the field. They were able to see that *Geography* really is about what is all around us! An exhausting but equally exciting day.

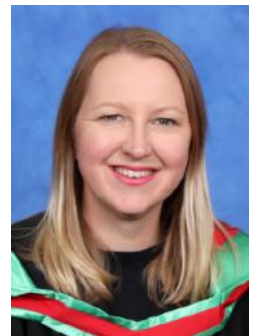


## LIBRARY NEWS

## Shape Nomination 2020

A team will select approximately 50 projects from around the State to be displayed at the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney. A nomination is a significant achievement for the College, but to have the whole class nominated is also noteworthy. Congratulations to Brianna Ollis, Zara Luxford and Riley Boon. Here is a summary of their projects again:

**Brianna Ollis:** *My project aims to encourage families with young children to compost whilst informing them about the impact of food waste in an accessible manner.*



**Zara Luxford:** *My project is a collection of girl's clothing that is made from sustainable and recycled materials such as tablecloths and second hand clothing/fabrics that could replace a child's wardrobe and be worn throughout each season.*

**Riley Boon:** *I created an 'Electronic Kiosk Kit' which is a DIY electronics and Internet-Of-Things project aimed at encouraging young people to explore the electronics and programming world. The project is Raspberry Pi based which includes features such as an app-controlled light, wireless phone charging, the weather, calendar synchronisation and Spotify integration.*
