This year has certainly been one for the history books. From destructive bushfires raging through our shire to a global pandemic, 2020 has been a year many of us would rather forget.

Term 1 started out as any other year. Kindergarten commenced on Thursday, Week 1, the remainder of the Primary years on the Friday. The term took off and we got into the swing of things fairly quickly. There was mention of a virus in the news, the Government was monitoring the spread and here at WAC we were business as usual.

There was no predicting the events that were to unfold over the next few months.

There is no doubt 'lockdown' changed many of us. For me personally, it was hard not to be able to spend time with friends and family. It hurt my children not to be able to see or hug their grandparents. I felt guilty that the only way our children were communicating with their friends and classmates was through the very screen that I would normally spend a great deal of time telling them to get off, only now to be thankful for that very technology which enabled them to stay connected and feel less isolated.

I believe character is defined in how we conduct ourselves through challenging situations. I like to learn from experience so I can grow as a person. I'd like to share some of the things I learned from the challenges we faced this year.

Firstly, the importance of gaining a new perspective. We were forced to look beyond ourselves to see things from an entirely different point of view. We had a chance to refocus on the things we need in our lives and those we don't. What is important when everything else has been stripped away. Perspective has let us see the world and ourselves in a new way. It has given us an opportunity to make a choice and change whatever isn't working for us.

Secondly, enjoying and focusing on the simple things in life. During lockdown, life didn't just slow down, it came to a grinding halt. Our weekends were suddenly free. Sport was cancelled. Social catch ups, dinners, birthday parties were put on hold. Time was all we had. Time to sit and read without feeling guilty, time to learn a new skill, time to work on our patience and attempt to play board games with our children without having an emotional breakdown. Us, not them. Time for family movie nights, quality time for getting to know each other. Time to slow down, be present and enjoy the simple things in life. Like it or not.

Thirdly, being flexible. Even the best laid plans can fall apart. I remember feeling very proud and organised in the fact that before Term 1 commenced I was already ahead of the game with my program written for the whole term. A program I had spent many days working on over the holidays. Then, overnight I learned we were going to an online learning platform and all that work was gone. It required adapting, changing and rewriting. This year has taught me more than ever about the importance of being flexible. Of rolling with the punches and learning to accept 'what is' rather than fight against what 'should be'.

Lastly, and the most important lesson I have learnt from this year is that God is in control, not us. Our generation has never experienced the trials and adversity that former generations have. Many of us have a good job and a nice home. We enjoy the spoils ever growing technology provides. We are used to having what we want, when we want it. We expect it, we demand it. So when a pandemic comes and interrupts everything, we don't cope so well. We panic buy toilet paper in an effort to regain control, fooling ourselves into thinking something like this will give our control back. It wasn't just the toilet paper. It was the way people behaved towards each other during the panic buying of the pandemic that saddened me. It really highlighted how far we as a society have fallen away from God. That in desperate times we would turn on each other over toilet paper.

So what is my hope for the future as we emerge from the trenches of 2020. I feel confident as I walk through our College and hear the conversations of our children encouraging each other, supporting each other and showing kindness, that we would share, not fight, over our toilet paper. As I walk through the College I see the children showing the fruits of the spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, forgiveness and self-control. It reassures me here at WAC that we are not a broken society, rather a blessed community, working hard to share the example Christ set for us.

FROM THE INTERIM HEADMASTER

Asset Protection Zone

During the Christmas break the College is required to carry out an Asset Protection Zone (APZ) clearing on the College property.

The conditions within our current and previously approved Development Applications with Wollondilly Council require us to create the APZ. An APZ clearing is the reduction of trees, shrubs and general bush vegetation within a specific area to reduce the fire fuel level to a required minimum near buildings.

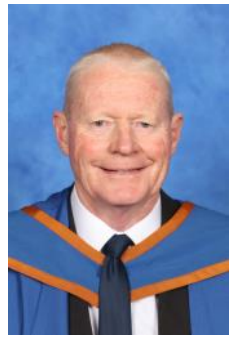
The area impacted by the APZ is 70 metres from our buildings along the North, North/Western and Western sides of the College. It also affects the gully between the Flynn building and the car park on the Eastern side of Flynn.

While the clearing of trees and other vegetation is unfortunate, we are required to follow strict regulations in carrying out the clearing of an APZ and it cannot be avoided. Some mature species will be retained and we are also employing an Ecologist to assess the affected area to identify any habitats in the designated area. If identified, the process will ensure they are either retained or relocated appropriately prior to any clearing starting.

We also plan to collect seeds from some of the existing vegetation to enable us to propagate seedlings for replanting in areas outside of the APZ.

On the completion of the clearing works, the area will undergo some landscaping and native grass seeding to bring this area up to a space our students can enjoy.

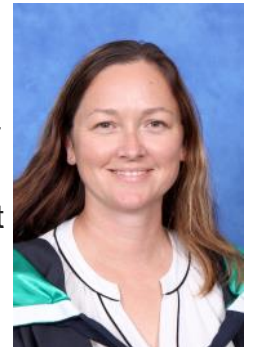

Just a reminder to parents that the last official day for Year 10 for Term 4 is tomorrow, Friday, 4 December.

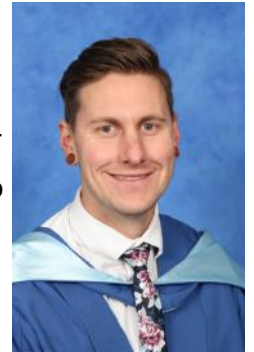
Year 12 2020-2021

PASTORAL MATTERS - MIDDLE YEARS 5-8



What's your brand?

Everything we post online is a piece of the puzzle that makes up our digital brand or reputation. Sometimes brands are damaged when things go wrong. It can take a company or an individual a long time to recover from a damaged reputation.

Actions and behaviours that can damage your digital reputation include:

- sending other people's pictures without their consent
- using profile pictures that send the wrong message
- following posts or accounts that are not positive or nice
- cyberbullying and posting hateful comments.

Building and maintaining a strong brand

There are a few things to consider when posting online:

- Personal strengths - what are the things you are good at?
- Values - are the things you think are important and the things you believe in demonstrated in the digital trail you are leaving?
- Personal standards - what does an outsider see when they look at the things you are creating online?
- Positive contribution - do you contribute to your community in any way? A strong brand develops when you contribute positively to something bigger than yourself.
- Being an advocate and positive influence for others - do you actively stand up for others who may need support? Are your posts positive and uplifting?

Strategies we can use to control our information and images that are shared online and ways that we can build a positive digital brand.

These might include:

- choosing your online contacts carefully and limiting your contacts
- checking your privacy settings and enabling two factor authentication
- being considerate about what you post about yourself and others
- checking who can see your accounts or posts
- posting positive images or examples of your own work
- reading and understanding what information you are agreeing to share via the terms and conditions
- untagging yourself in photos and messages that don't reflect your values

The eSafety Guide has advice on how to change privacy settings for particular social media platforms.

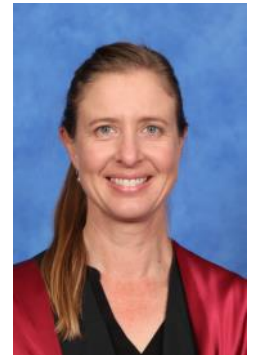

Thank you to Mr Hart for his assistance on the day - it was superb!

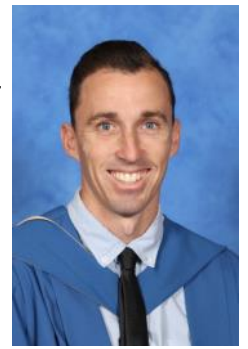

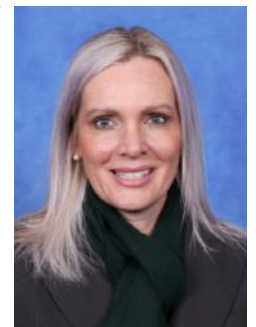
